

Message from outgoing EVP Dana Taylor

My last word: "Farewell"



As the month of June wears on, my transition to retirement from MCABC & Co. will be complete. And as there have been many words passed in this newsletter from me to you over the years, in this edition I will focus on some reflections of the past.

In January 1990 when I arrived at MCABC, then located on Burnaby's Lake City Way, the office had

two computers (firmly under the control of a secretary and administrative assistants), a fax machine and the usual telephones – and electric typewriters. There was no internet, no email, no websites. To use a computer

you had to know the early operating system, DOS. Bookkeeping was done longhand, and then ritually transferred onto spreadsheets. The annual budget unfolded like a newspaper taped together in pieces. Oh, those were ancient times.

However, we managed it and gradually transformed to use all the modern conveniences that help us serve you today. To my mind, this is simply what occurs through the passage of time – people adjust and organizations evolve. If you haven't had a similar experience, I promise you will.

In the mid-1990s when we purchased the current office space, it seemed like a new era had arrived with renewed interest among members in all the services provided by provincial and national MCAs. Our education offerings expanded and many issues captured our time and attention: code amendments, contractor licensing, a re-vamped sub-sub bid depository, industry

and trades training systems, and in more recent years, prompt payment legislation. These issues dominated the work of MCABC boards and staff.

Over my time we have experienced Social Credit, NDP, Liberal, and now, once again, NDP provincial governments. I won't list all the federal governments, except to say even more changes occurred back and forth between Liberal and Conservative regimes.

My main observation about the various ruling governments – federal and provincial – is that overall they have not served trade associations well. In fact, trade associations are taken for granted because, I think,

association members are stable society participants. Our demands are never great or outrageous and therefore don't really need attending to. The result is that sensible 'good governance' requests are often ignored.

Politics aside, there are many things that MCABC does well regardless of the direction of political winds. Education and information are key. MCA Canada has gathered a host of mechanical contracting-related courses and programs that service all facets of the mechanical contractors' business.

Delivering those programs has always been a challenge. Opportunity lies in using the ever-improving technologies to make information available to all members who demand it.

A lesser known part of my work over the years had to do with the special affiliated relationships MCABC experienced and my parallel responsibilities that accompanied those relationships. I am speaking primarily of my work as manager of MIRA – a group of MCABC members who are signatory to collective bargaining agreements with the union. It is a simple fact that the unionized sector not only created MCABC's predecessor some 114 years ago, but its sister entities have generously supported the organization ever since. This relationship, however, has also been seen as an impediment to growth – to expanding the membership of MCABC to include more contractors who do not have union affiliations. It did not seem to matter how many times we explained that there was no undue influence

exercised by this sector. The links were a barrier by their very existence. A transformed relationship will remove that barrier in the future as MCABC's new CEO and its Board of Directors move forward with initiatives that will re-shape the organization to attract all mechanical contractors.

As with any farewell, it is cliché but true and necessary to say that the experience would not have been the same without the people I've worked with. The mentorship and wisdom shared by several members have guided me well in my work over the years. With my departure I celebrate my experience not just with the people I've

met but with the opportunity that the association afforded me, one I hope will not change.

My efforts and achievements, for better or worse, were the result of the various boards I've reported to with MCABC, MIRA, JTIP and the now-departed Island boards, of the board members trusting and permitting me to act honestly with considerable discretion in the best interests of the organizations I have served. This relative freedom enabled me to act openly and

This relative freedom enabled me to act openly and transparently in all my dealings with members, the public and my overseers, and thus to focus on the work at hand without having to worry my efforts were being undermined for internal or political reasons. And when those occasions occurred – and they did occur – the boards and members supported me even when they did

I came to believe from the reactions of some that if I appeared to be enjoying my work too much, they thought I was up to no good. I believe that my years of service and methods of operation have vindicated me. I have enjoyed much of my work too much and now, that too has ended.






