

BCICA contractors exclude insulation of some Victaulic fittings from scope of work

BCICA (BC Insulation Contractors Association) has given notice that its contractors will exclude the insulation of Victualic QuickVic SD fittings for piping 2" & under (valves, tees, etc.) from the MI Scope of Work.

BCICA reports that there are currently no manufactured solutions for a PVC fitting cover for QuickVic fittings. Installing insulation on these fittings poses challenges that, in some cases, make it impossible to comply with the insulation specifications and increase the overall cost, the BCICA reports.

In answer to this report from BCICA, Victaulic states the following:

There are existing PVC covers which can be used with QVSD products, including a range of off-the-shelf PVC fitting covers manufactured by Proto Corporation, of Clearwater, FL. These are suited for use with the QuickVic SD product line. Proto Corporation is known as a leading manufacturer of PVC fitting covers and jacketing systems for the North American insulation industry, and is a member in good standing of the Thermal Insulation Association of Canada and the National Insulation Association (USA). Proto Corporation's products are readily available to BCICA members from major wholesalers in British Columbia.

Changes to Gas Fireplace Standards



The Province of British Columbia recently made changes to gas fireplace standards in its Energy Efficiency Standards Regulation. The updated standards are effective for products manufactured on or after January 1, 2019.

The updated standard defines two types of gas fireplaces: vented gas fireplace heaters, also known as fireplace heaters, and vented decorative gas appliances, also known as decorative fireplaces. Fireplace heaters and decorative fireplaces must meet the prescribed standards and have an energy efficiency verification (EEV) label affixed (on or immediately adjacent) to the rating plate.
