Trevor Hildebrand, Phase Mechanical, Leads During Transformative Time

In 1999, Trevor was elected to the Board of Directors for the then named Edelweiss Credit Union and was part of the Board Merger Committee when Edelweiss and Fraser Valley Credit Union joined to become Prospera Credit Union. During his time on the Board, Trevor was Chair of Prospera Insurance Company, the credit union representative on the Ubiquity Bank of Canada, Vice Chair for four years and a member of the Audit, Governance and Executive Committees. Trevor was also a member of BCIT's Apprenticeship Committee.

A champion of change and good governance, an advocate for skilled trades development and a firm believer in the strength of a collective voice, Trevor will lead MCABC's newly-elected <u>Board of Directors</u>.

If you had to lay off employees during COVID-19 it is important to note that the 16 week temporary lay-off period is soon coming to an end. We know this has potentially significant ramifications for small and medium-sized businesses that have not yet recovered from the impact of the pandemic and are not yet ready to bring back their employees but will be required to pay severance. The call for an extension of the lay-off period has not been accepted and there is no indication that Labour Minister Bains will use Ministerial Order for an extension. The BC Chamber of Commerce is asking for two minutes of your time to complete a short <u>survey</u>. Your voice matters and the Chamber of Commerce wants to be sure that it is heard.


