



2023-24 MCABC Nominees Represent Industry Breadth and Priorities

Common themes have emerged for those running for MCABC's Board of Directors for the 2023-24 term. The slate of eight nominees put forward by this year's Nominations Committee, which considered MCABC's five-year strategic plan and industry composition to ensure a balanced Board, have a shared focus on trades training and recruitment; they also each represent a key part of the mechanical contracting industry in new construction and the built environment.

The eight nominees, four of whom will be elected, include companies involved in installation, mechanical service, and refrigeration. They also represent a larger sectoral group that includes residential and regions outside of the Lower Mainland.

Goals as an MCABC Board Member
